It is what it's termed to be i.e. an investment. Furthermore, our history shows that an investment in education reaps rich dividends for any country which is enlightened enough to maintain the investment at appropriate levels.

Ireland and Portugal are both going through very difficult times financially. Both your union and our union are very conscious of this. We are not naive nor are we in denial about the state of the real economy. However, it is undeniable that both countries will require a vibrant energetic and relevant higher education system if we are ever to drag ourselves out of the depths of economic stagnation to which we have been reduced.
